



# Saxilby Church of England School

## Analysis of Use and Impact of Sports Premium Saxilby Primary School 2016/2017

From April 2013, the Government announced that it would be providing additional funding to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools. This funding has been made available to schools since then.

This initiative has been devised to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport across primary schools. It is intended that this funding will promote healthy lifestyle choices and give children the opportunities to reach the performance levels they are capable of. Although for 2016/2017 the government had pledged to double this amount through the 'Sugar Tax' schools have not yet seen an increase in funding mainly due to the general election this year and it is still unclear as to the level we will receive for 2017/2018. Saxilby will be creating an action plan that will take both levels of funding into account with the focus being on ensuring a legacy that will benefit all the children attending the school.

Saxilby Church of England Primary School places great value on PE and sport in the curriculum and in the wider life of school. Since 2012 we have had a specialist sports teacher and coordinator who has taught PE across the school and delivered high quality after school sports clubs. We have embedded 2 hours of PE for all children from KS1 and KS2.

During 2016 2017 Saxilby was awarded the Sainsbury's Schools Silver Mark for PE and school sport.

### Sports Apprentices

During this academic year Saxilby has employed two sports apprentices

### Swimming

As a school we are very committed to each and every child's swimming development. We go beyond the statutory requirements to ensure children have the opportunity to develop their swimming way beyond just 25 metres by taking the children swimming every year in line with recommendations from the ASA that every child throughout their primary school career should access 24 hours of swimming lessons.

With the implementation of the ASA School Swimming Charter swimming is now progressive and assessed effectively to inform planning for the following year.

During 2016/2017 100% of year 6 children left with the minimum requirement of 25m, Water Safety and personal survival Awards, with 83% gaining 100m or more.

A recent survey of the children showed that 53% of children in year 3/4 would not have had the opportunity to attend swimming lessons if it was not part of the school curriculum, in year 5/6 62.6% of children would not have accessed lessons with 11% of year 6 saying throughout their time at Saxilby they had only attended school swimming lessons and therefore would not be able to swim if not given that opportunity.

### Sports Week

During June the school hosted sports week with the aim of introducing the children to sports not usually on offer in school and enabling them to access some local clubs, activities and sports they can follow out of school., as well as inspiring the children with alternative ways to keep active.

The climbing wall was a huge success, all pupils in EYFS Years 1,2,3 and 5 participating.

The skipping workshops were great for promoting active and positive play times.

Lots of activities were organized both centrally and within the classrooms to give the children a fantastic experience.

The playground zoning has been enhanced with the provision of barriers to enable football and other organized games to be played without affecting activities on the playground ensuring a safer environment.

### **Extra-Curricular and lunchtime activities**

During 2016/ 2017 80% of children have been involved with lunchtime and after school clubs. 12% of which have participated in a sporting club for the first time this year. This is due to the addition of golf and cricket clubs run by Mr Otter where pupil premium and reluctant children have been asked if they would like to attend.

Hurricane Sports Coaching have run 2 general sports clubs one in each key Stage to enhance the after school sports club provision.

### **Competition achievements**

Pupils are very keen to be actively involved in school sport and curriculum PE. They look forward to lessons and engage well with both in PE and extracurricular activities.

Saxilby School Sports Ambassadors were established last year and alongside House Captains been actively involved in house matches leading and refereeing the competitions ensuring 100% of KS2 children have been involved in house competitions this year.

During sports week 100% of children attending Saxilby School had the opportunity to compete in sports day.
