Analysis of Use and Impact of Sports Premium Saxilby Primary School 2014/2015

From April 2013, the Government announced that it would be providing additional funding to improve the provision of PE and sport in primary schools. This funding has been made available to schools since then.

This initiative has been devised to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport across primary schools. It is intended that this funding will promote healthy lifestyle choices and give children the opportunities to reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Saxilby Church of England Primary School places great value on PE and sport in the curriculum and in the wider life of school. Since 2012 we have had a specialist sports teacher and coordinator who has taught PE across the school and delivered high quality after school sports clubs. We have embedded 2 hours of PE for all children from KS1 and KS2.

The Sports Premium funding enabled the school to buy in to the Cherry Willingham Schools Sports Partnership, which has enabled all staff access 1:1 mentoring in delivering high quality PE. This has enabled teachers to have the confidence and subject knowledge to teach their own PE in 2015/2016.

Mrs Wilkinson has attended a level 5 & 6 PE Coordinators course in order to ensure that the subject is well led across the school. The impact of this has been that Saxilby now has a PE progression plan in place from EYFS to Year 6, a school overview of what is taught in PE and a system of assessing the children in PE to ensure progression for every child. Planning and resources are available for the teachers to access.

Swimming

As a school we are very committed to each and every child's swimming development. We go beyond the statutory requirements to ensure children have the opportunity to develop their swimming way beyond just 25 metres by taking the children swimming every year in Key Stage 2. This year we committed to the ASA School Swimming Charter. This has allowed us to ensure that school swimming is progressive and all children achieve their potential. During 2014/2015 100% of year 6 children left with the minimum requirement of 25m with 85% gaining 100m or more and 100% gaining awards in Water Safety.

Extra-Curricular and lunchtime activities

Participation & Achievements

Pupils are very keen to be actively involved in school sport and curriculum PE. They look forward to lessons and engage well with both in PE and extracurricular activities. Saxilby School Sports Ambassadors has been established this year with a group of 12 children being appointed to help with lunch and playtime activities. The playground is zoned with different activities on offer for the children at lunch and playtimes. The impact of this has been that the midday supervisor team have reported more positive experiences and attitudes to play at lunchtimes. The children have also taken full responsibility for equipment. Universal Free school Meals impacted on our lunchtime club arrangements but through our continued commitment to this provision there is still an offer of extra-curricular clubs at lunchtimes.
