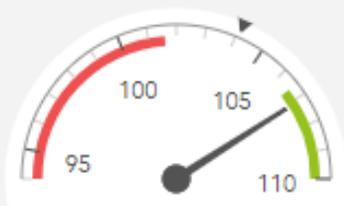

Average Scaled Score (Re, Ma)

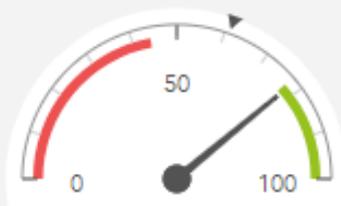

Average Scaled Score (Re, Ma)

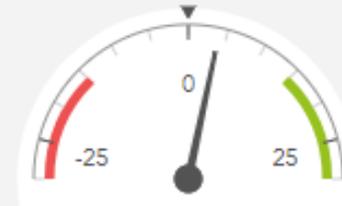

# School Improvement Planning 2017-2018

To further develop the teaching of Mastery in Maths maintaining the highest rates of progress and attainment through

- Skilful questioning within lessons to promote conceptual understanding (Drury, 2014, Jones, 2014, Guskey, 2009)
- Identifying and rapidly acting on misconceptions which arise through same day intervention (Stripp, 2014, MathsHubs, 2015a) (ARK, 2015).
- Challenging, through rich and sophisticated problems, those pupils who grasp concepts rapidly, before any acceleration through new content. (NCETM, 2014)
- Developing learners' responses to reason and justify their findings and solutions through peer tutoring and collaborative learning
- Use of concrete, pictorial and abstract representations according to levels of conceptual development (Jones, 2014, Drury, 2014)

To ensure maximize progress for all groups in writing through

- Embedding our strong AfL practices across school, especially with our new teaching staff
- Tracking children against prior attainment groups and ensuring watch lists, intervention and Performance Management targets are based on prior attainment
- Develop provision through challenge for highest prior attaining groups

To develop the provision across school to secure the highest levels of mental wealth, ensuring mental health and wellbeing are integral to the life and work of school through a highly effective waved approach prior to external agency engagement

### *Wave One*

A proactive, not reactive curriculum offer that actively develops PSH education and building resilience

Actively develop children's

- Coping strategies
- Belief in own ability to control events
- Attention
- Emotional regulation / emotional health
- Resilience

### *Wave Two*

Dedicated in school services for children (Kelvin, 2014) through

- Drop in sessions
- Communication systems eg worry boxes
- Group interventions
- Online support

To further improve the well being of our adults within school through reviewing workload and working conditions
